

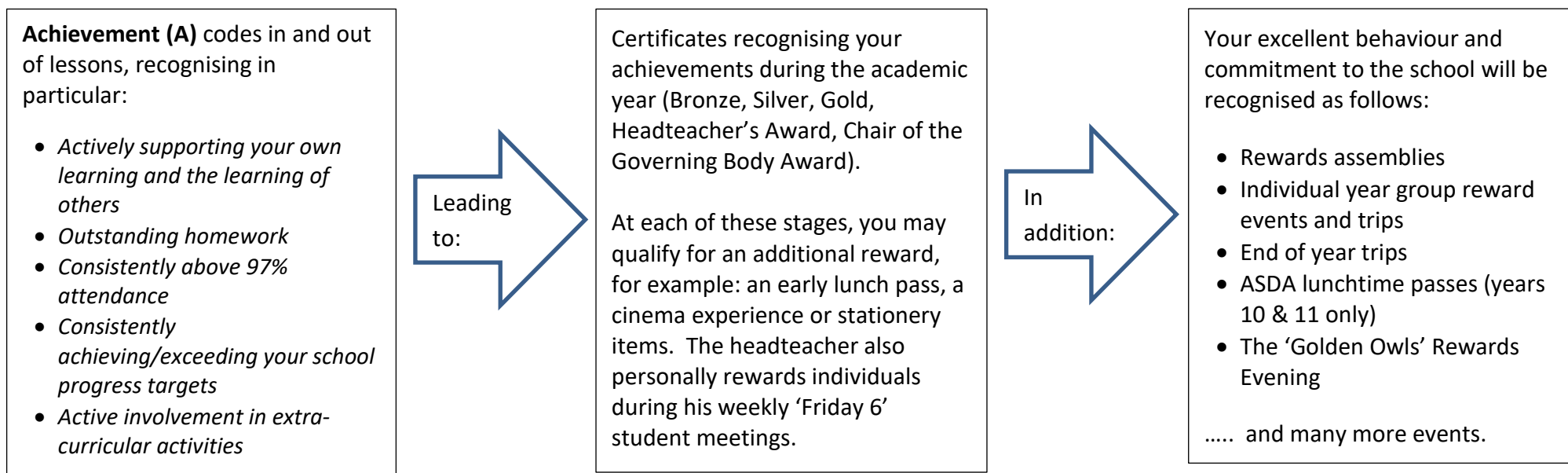
Behaviour for Learning Policy – Student version

The school's expectations for standards of behaviour are high and designed to encourage a calm and purposeful environment for learning. Our Behaviour for Learning Policy is based upon the following core principles:

- All students have the right to learn
- All staff have the right to teach and to support teaching
- The school environment should be a safe place for all
- Students will be supported in taking responsibility for their own behaviour
- The school environment will be free from bullying, prejudice, violence and intimidation
- Positive behaviour will be encouraged, recognised and rewarded
- School staff are in charge

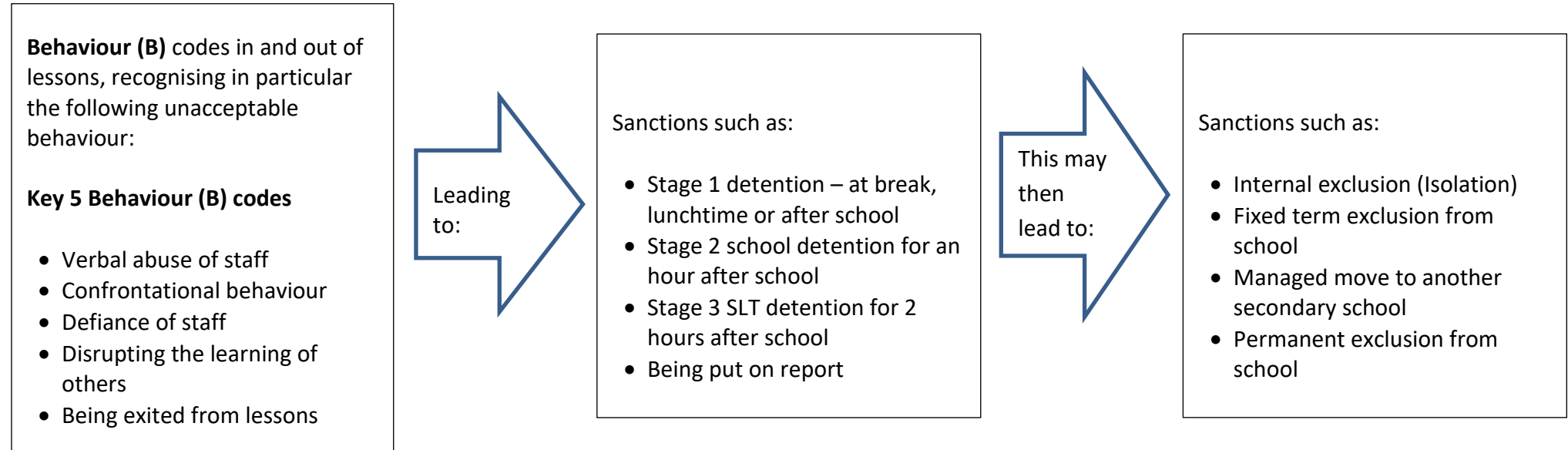
Recognising appropriate Behaviour for Learning

If your behaviour in lessons and around school/in the wider school community meets or exceeds the school's expectations, this will be recognised by staff and you will be rewarded in the following ways:



Recognising and sanctioning inappropriate Behaviour for Learning

If your behaviour in lessons and around school/in the wider school community does not meet the school's high expectations, you will be sanctioned (punished) as follows:



Behaviour for Learning – What can you expect in lessons?

Your teachers and other classroom staff will expect only the highest level of behaviour for learning from you at all times. If your behaviour is a cause for concern in a lesson, the classroom staff will use the following procedure. This gives you a maximum of two chances to correct your behaviour before you will be sanctioned with a detention. The procedure works like this:

	Action	Consequences
Stage 1	You choose not to behave in an appropriate way.	Your teacher will ASK you to correct your behaviour. Your teacher may warn you that if you do not correct your behaviour, you will be given an 'in-class sanction'.
Stage 2	You choose not to correct your behaviour after your teacher has ASKED you to.	Your teacher will now TELL you to correct your behaviour. Your teacher may TELL you, for example, to move seats, to stop a practical activity or to leave the classroom and wait outside. This is an 'In-class sanction'.
Stage 3	You choose not to correct your behaviour after your teacher has TOLD you to.	You will be SANCTIONED , usually with a detention which will be recorded in your planner. Your parents/carers will be informed and may be asked to come into school to discuss your unacceptable behaviour.
